Hello and welcome to the latest edition of the Aylesbury Now newsletter. It's been about a year since our last edition but we are now back to sending this newsletter every three months so we can keep you up to date on activity on the Aylesbury.

There's lots happening over the winter period and we're looking forward to our Winter Wonderland festival on Thursday 7 December. It's set to be big with over 20 stalls already confirmed – we hope to see you there!



As you'll know we've had lots of movement on the Aylesbury with large sections of Plot 18 now complete and residents moving into Marson Place with Notting Hill Genesis and FDS A with Southwark Council. In this newsletter we'll let you know the latest on each phase as well as about ongoing and upcoming activities and opportunities for the local community.

Aylesbury regeneration overview

The Notting Hill Genesis team

Notting Hill Genesis was chosen as Southwark Council's development partner for the Aylesbury regeneration in early 2014. Notting Hill Genesis is a housing association and registered provider of social housing. The team working on the Aylesbury regeneration manage the design and construction of the new buildings and surrounding public space. Throughout the lifetime of the project we'll be working with local partners to create job and training opportunities and offer ways for residents to get involved in the regeneration.



Construction update

Plot 18

The new Una Marson library on Plot 18 will be opening soon for the whole community. By spring 2024 we'll also have the new health centre building and the rest of the public space will be completed.

The old GP surgery will be demolished to pave way for the new road at Lebanon Street in time for next summer.

First Development Site C

In April this year we entered a build contract with Hill Partnerships to deliver 321 homes as part of the regeneration. This also includes a commercial space and a public park.

Work on the foundations was completed in October and the team are now working on the substructure (below ground level) and reinforced concrete frame to construct the base. The building will start to come off the ground around the beginning of the new year. You will see artwork displayed on the hoarding that features the winning artwork from the recent Aylesbury Art Prize, selected by a panel of local artists and community champions. You can find out more about that on page six.

Site will be closed between 22 December 2023 and 3 January 2024. There will be site security and monitored CCTV. Hill's out of hours contact number: 0800 032 6760.

Phase 2B

The first stage of preparing for demolition has been completed. Following the January 2023 resolution to approve at planning committee, we are working through some technical details with Southwark Council and the GLA. You will soon see artwork created by local young people displayed around the hoarding on Phase 2B, as part of a community art project.

Omobolaji's story



Meet Omobolaji, who we helped start his engineering career and who has moved into one of the first new homes on the Aylesbury estate.

Omobolaji has lived on the Aylesbury estate since 2012, two years before we took on the regeneration in 2014. When Omobolaji completed his engineering degree at London Southbank University he had some trouble finding a permanent job. Our programme manager, Chris Cotton, helped him by looking out for opportunities he could get involved in.

Chris came across a programme Transport for London was running with their contractors to help young people get into work and managed to get Omobolaji into it. Out of this Omobolaji was able to get into his first permanent role. He has since gone on to do a masters qualification so he could progress further. He said: "I just wanted to prove to myself I was capable. I was surprised though when my results came and I got a distinction!"

At the beginning of August this year, Omobolaji moved from his one-bed flat on the Aylesbury estate to the newly built flats on what is known as phase A of the first development site with Southwark Council.

"I've been heavily involved, along with other residents, in the consultation process for the regeneration," says Omobolaji. "The flat is so spacious for my family. It's great that I didn't have to move from the area and the community I love so much."

His daughter Grace, aged six, was particularly happy to have her own room and no longer have to share with her parents.

Helping our residents get on their bike

We're so proud of our work to help fund the fantastic initiative, Community Cycleworks. Since 2021 the group has been running bike fix workshops from a fitted-out 40ft container.

Typically, people come to sessions because they want to learn how to fix their bikes themselves and want to do this as inexpensively as possible, often with second-hand parts. But the team also want to build confidence by showing people how to cycle on the road and get to grips with basic repair skills.

Community Cycleworks wants a healthier, cleaner, and more sustainable world in which all young people have access to a bike, skills to repair it and the ability to ride. Their passion is empowering people to be mechanically self-

sufficient and choose cycling as an everyday mode of transport. We are delighted to support Community Cycleworks' fantastic work and contribute to making this vision a reality on the Aylesbury Estate.


'I enjoyed creating my piece of artwork as it was very relaxing. I liked choosing different colours and symbols to represent myself.' (Safia)

Get growing – beds available in our community garden

Our community garden has been extended and we have raised beds available to anyone living on the Aylesbury who's interested in starting their own garden.

Earlier this year, the interim space we used for our community garden on Albany Road had to close. This had been operated by OK Grow since March 2021. This community garden had been well used and encouraged local gardeners to grow their own food, while also providing produce for local food pantries.

To keep the garden going we created an extension to the existing community garden at Missenden. Started by the Creation Trust, the garden has been running for more than 20 years and is now managed by the Aylesbury tenants and residents association.

The extension involved moving 22 planters to the site with help from the team at Hill – especially David Griffiths. The Kinglake tenants and residents association also lent a hand, with one gardener organising soil from the Surrey Square nature reserve and 10 planters to create a garden at Kinglake Estate.

Three of the gardeners who had been at the previous community garden have now taken new raised flower beds. On seeing the garden outside

her window one of the residents said she was “so excited to finally have her own garden after 23 years”.

Are you interested in starting your own garden? All you need to do is pay for a refundable key deposit along with an annual sign-up fee of £1 which goes towards replacement equipment. Tools and watering cans are provided and you can keep your garden for as long as you want.

Wellbeing

Let's Care Together Programme (New programme from Business In The Community BITC)

Let's Care Together focusses on supporting unpaid carers with their wellbeing and is supported by Simplyhealth. We know that unpaid Carers have worse wellbeing outcomes than non-carers, and are likely to be time-poor due to their caring responsibilities. The programme aims to support carers by streamlining access to resources and providing practical support across the four pillars of wellbeing: Physical, Mental, Social and Financial. This support will include helping Carers to connect with friends and family, community groups and wider support, find wellbeing information and gain financial confidence.

The Volunteers will help to:

- Improve their overall wellbeing and health
- Increase their Social Wellbeing by increasing feelings of connectedness, and looking to establish community links
- Increased feelings of financial independence and access to financial tools
- Improved access to support for physical wellbeing, as well as tools and practical support
- Support with mental wellbeing by reducing feelings of isolation
- By improving the carer's wellbeing, we will be extending the benefits of the programme out to the household they support.

Carers being referred must be 18 years or over, with good conversational English, and have access to a mobile phone and laptop



Debt & Budgeting Support

Debt Free Service

Debt Free London, now known as Debt Free Advice offers free, face to face debt advice across London. They do this through partner organisations who provide expert advisors tackling all types of money worries from rent arrears to catalogue debt. They provide assistance to prioritise bills & debts, helping to write letters and advocating on people's behalf.

Energy Support

South London Healthy Homes

South London Healthy Homes provide help for vulnerable residents to stay warm and healthy.

We can provide a support package to help vulnerable residents stay warm and healthy during the colder months.

Keeping warm over the winter months can help prevent colds, flu or more serious health conditions such as heart attacks, strokes, pneumonia and depression which affect more vulnerable people. South London Healthy Homes can offer free help to anyone living in South London who is: over 65, on a low income, has a long term health conditions or disability.

Our South London Healthy Homes programme provides support packages to those most in need. A referral to the scheme provides people with a free winter home, financial and health support package including:

- Energy efficiency advice
- Install energy saving devices
- Support home improvement grant applications
- Offer impartial advice that will help you heat your home for less
- Connect you to other sources of help



British Gas Trust Fund

British Gas has a charity grant for energy debt write off for both British Gas Customers and Non-British Gas Customers.

Debt write-off for electric and/or gas debt between £250 - £1,500 however residents must go through a debt advisor to make the application and support any other debts they have.

Customers of Boost, Eon, Eon Next, EDF, Scottish Power, Ovo, Octopus, SSE and Utilita (Credit Customers only) have their own funds to support their customers, so if you are a customer of one of these companies please apply to them.

There are two types

- The British Gas Energy Support Fund (British Gas Customers Only)
- Individuals and Families Fund (All customers with exceptions – stated in the website)

Applicants are required to have gone through money/debt advice before applying for the 'British Gas Trust Fund'.

HACT Fuel Vouchers

HACT has received funds to provide fuel vouchers to social housing residents with pre-payment meters who are facing financial pressures. Please note that British Gas customers are not eligible to receive fuel vouchers, because British Gas does not accept Pay Point vouchers and they also have funds available for their customers in hardship.

The fund 2023-24 from November 2023 until October 2024, or beforehand if they run out before this date.

Each tenant is eligible to receive a maximum of six £49 vouchers to assist them with their fuel costs over the duration of the twelve-month fuel fund – subject to availability. Vouchers will be redeemable through Pay Point only.




For a resident to be eligible for support, households must:

- be facing financial pressures
- be at risk of self-disconnection
- have a pre-payment meter

Proof of evidence/documents to be provided are:

- Rent Statement
- Proof of benefit entitlement
- Picture of the pre-payment meter



Food Support

The Trussell Trust

The Trussell Trust is a foodbank that helps provide food to anyone who is really struggling to put food on the table. The Trussell Trust will be able to provide you with 3 days' worth of emergency food supply once a referral has been made. If you are struggling to buy food and need a referral to a foodbank then please contact Soifur for more information.
